The Saddle Stroller!!

Here's a GREAT, inexpensive, easy, convenient saddle stroller to move your saddles and tack around the barn or for your next trail trip.

Typical rolling saddle racks are wingy, flip over, unstable and can't hold hardly anything. Stroller manufacturers have spent millions researching and creating strong, sturdy, safe jogging strollers for the kiddos..... and we can benefit from it.

I found the Baby Trends are the best. And the Best of the Best are the Expedition ELX

I found this one used on Facebook marketplace for \$35.



Lots of different colors too.

The ELX has a few extra nice features, like a huge bottom basket, one handed folding, and an extra sturdy hood.

It also has a front wheel that can swivel or be locked in the straight position.

They all come with a nice set of brakes to hold it in place too.

The ELX has a handle that can lock in 3 positions.

This model also has an .mp3 player with speakers and a convenient cubby for little things.

Top it all off with 4 bottle holders and WOW! Perfect for all the horsey fun!



There are only a couple things I do to the stroller to make it better for the saddle.

I drill a small hole (see photo) on each side of the hood and put a zip tie to help hold the hood in place.





I also add a small hand weight to the front to keep it from tipping over backward. I put the weight in a cloth bag, but you can just zip tie it on there.



They also fold up fairly small so you can hang them in the trailer or tack room if you are not using them.

We use them in the barn – they are our everyday saddle racks as well as moving saddle strollers. We store all our saddle strollers in one empty stall. They hold the saddle skirts and fenders with good shape. We just wheel it to the grooming stall or in the arena or into the trailer and we know we have ALL of our tack in one handy spot.

The tires are great on a variety of terrain - grass, sandy arenas, gravel or even mud!

If it gets dirty, just hose it off!

This stroller is filled to the top, a big western on top, the smaller English saddle underneath on the seat. The handle is also great for hanging girths, bridles and you can see the bottom basket is filled with lots of extras. It's best to place the heavy western saddles with stirrups toward the handle, the hood will support it better.
